Moszkowski, who was born at Breslau in the year 1854 is well known as a composer of much charming music of the lighter kind. Some of his Pianoforte pieces are held in high popular esteem. In the larger forms of Opera and Symphonic Poem he has also written with success. The Ballet Music to be given on this occasion is taken from his opera Boabdil, which was produced at Berlin in 1892.

LADY MAUD WARRENDER.

Elgar's new work is of small compass, and, notwithstanding a few strenuous outbursts, is in the main quiet and contemplative in character. It bears something of the same relation to his larger works as the "Song of Destiny" does to the greater works of Brahms. The difficulty with undramatic or non-narrative poems of this kind is to give them musical unity. Elgar has surmounted the difficulty by means of a number of distinctive leading themes, some of them of a peculiarly eloquent and searching quality. Another device he has used -that of liberal quotation from earlier works of his own-will probably give rise to a little discussion at first, until the novelty of it has worn off. The surprising thing is that composers have not previously seen the new range of expression opened out to them by means of this system of allusive quotation. There ought really to be no more shyness as to quoting Bach or Wagner than as to quoting Shakespeare. Several composers have, indeed, experimented with the method. Mozart, Wagner and Richard Strauss, are among these, and Elgar has in this work, greatly expanded the method. Some of the quotations not only fit perfectly into the general musical tissue, but win a new eloquence from the words with which they are here associated. The work should prove popular.
